h) It + be + adj / noun + gerund (phrase)
$\times$ It's / so nice / sitting here with you.
$\times$ It's / no good / hoping for the help from the authorities.
× It's / no good / crying over the spilt milk.
i) How/what + adjective/noun + (it+be) + to-infinitive (phrase)
$\times$ How / nice / (it is ) + to sit here with you!
$\times$ What / a pity / (it is) / to waste them!
$\times$ What / a pity / (it would be ) / to ignore their advice.
