

# Introduction: HTML Table

## *cellpadding*

The cellpadding tag is used to create space between the text inside your table and the border surrounding that text.

**The code for the cellpadding tag goes inside the table tags and will look like this:**

```
<table border="1" bordercolor="red" cellpadding="10">  
  <tr>  
<td><B>row 1, column 1</B></td><td><B>row 1, columnn  
  2</B></td>  
  </tr>  
</table>
```

# Continue.....

- ***cellspacing***
- The cellspacing tag is to create space between different cells within your table.
- **The code for the cellspacing tag goes inside the table tags and will look like this:**
- ```
<table border="0" cellspacing="10">  
<tr>  
<td bgcolor="cccccc"><B>row 1, column  
1</B></td><td bgcolor="cccccc"><B>row 1,  
columnn 2</B></td>  
</tr>  
</table>
```

# HTML Table Basics

- Do you really want to create a table? Well, let's start with tables by looking at the table tag:
- `<table>`  
.....contents of table.....  
`</table>`
- The `<table>` tag begins the table, you place what you want inside, and end the table with the `</table>` tag. To begin adding contents to your table, you will need the `<tr>` and `<td>` tags. The `<tr>` stands for table row and the `<td>` stands for table data, which is what you will place after this tag. You end a table data section with the `</td>` tag and each table row with the `</tr>` tag. Here is a basic table with just one cell:
- `<table>`  
`<tr>`  
`<td>`  
This is my table!  
`</td>`  
`</tr>`  
`</table>`
- The table will turn out like this:
- This is my table!
